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MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY 08th Nov 2006 AT 7.00PM IN THE JEAN MACKIE CENTRE, DUNFERMLINE.

- 1] **Madam Chairman's Welcome / Apologies:** Madam Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting ... Apologies were received from Tom Brand & Dave Paterson (Fife Council), the Police report will be taken early to allow PC Miller to leave early.
- 8] **Police Report:** PC Steven Miller stated that there had not been a great deal of incidents with no pattern and no crimes of note. Wilma stated that there appears to be a young person sleeping rough in the area of woodland to the north of the football pitches off Robertson Rd, Police to investigate.
- 2] **Minutes:** The Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. They were moved by Kate Findlay and seconded by Lilah McKay.
- 3] **Matters Arising From Minutes:**

Parking at QMH: Parking has improved; today only 1 space available things have totally changed. No one has been informed that the Robertson Rd. Football Ground is available.ca Cycle Track modifications to the pavements

Bellyeoman View Estate Open Spaces: Discussions took place on the responses from the last mailing to residents, many thanks to Lilah for her help in the distribution of letters. We have 5 residents willing to stand for committee and a date will be set for a meeting to go forward, details will be given to residents. A letter was read out from a concerned resident detailing several points that should be addressed before acceptance of a factor. A detailed reply was sent and this is available in the correspondence. Issues will be brought to the attention of the council namely details of the area in question, the 10 year rule for council adoption, maintenance of the footpath & trees, damage to mature trees and waste dumping. A date and venue have to be arranged for the next stage of the process; this will be arranged and notified to all residents. Ongoing.

Colliston Rd.: Ongoing.

Leys Park Road Car Park: Gates are left open, issue as who is responsible? Transport services, Cllr Tolson to investigate. Other issues e.g. bottle banks and access to etc.

Lauriston Gardens Slope: House are nearly all ready for occupation; Ongoing.

Street Cleaning: Occasional cleaning is carried out, not acceptable, footpath maintenance. Ongoing.

Barriers & Steps: Dave Paterson to meet Wilma on site to view sites, Ongoing.

Public Transport: Wilma waiting on a reply from Stagecoach, also written to the Council to try and get the temporary Hospital bus terminus relocated closer to the town centre and made large enough for the demand. Cllr Tolson commented on these issues. Problems with town centre traffic management are ongoing.

School Report: Fife Education Service has given acceptance to the easiest option available to them without changing catchment areas, dual catchment areas.
