## MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY 13 AUG 2014 AT 7.00PM IN THE JEAN MACKIE CENTRE, DUNFERMLINE.

### **PRESENT:**

- 1] **Madam Chairman's Welcome / Apologies:** Madam Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting, Apologies were received from Douglas Campbell, Jessie Cartmell, Graeme Whyte & Cllr David Mogg,
- 2] **Minutes:** The Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. They were moved by Sylvia Reddie and seconded by Kate Findlay.
- 3] **Matters Arising From Minutes:**
  - Bellyeoman Road:** The surface in question was re-laid last week. (Richard said it was an average job and thus may not last long). There are still no lines and speed signs. (Cllr Law as going to contact Ian Jones).
  - Football Photograph:** David O'Donnell said all parents have given consent for publishing the photograph in the Newsletter. David's team have been allocated Paton Street Park, as their Park and there is a match on 14 August against the Kingseat Team. Cllr Law had a meeting with John O'Neill and David O'Donnell to discuss the situation. Complaints had been received about Craigston Park. Cllr Law said funding can be secured from the Community Trust if the Bellyeoman Community Council applied for it. John, David, Helen and Cara Hilton MSP had met in Cara's office to discuss the drainage situation. Richard proposed more facilities for our local parks (similar to Townhill - MUGA - outdoor fitness machines). He also suggested a mountain bike skills area suitable for mountain bike coaching, the areas around Townhill loch may be most suitable..
  - Barrier at Football Park:-** The dumping of rubbish on car park near bushes, this was removed by the council :- Ongoing
  - Travelling People:-** No concerns at the moment.
  - QMH, Robertson Rd Parking:-** Work not finished yet, Disabled parking Improved. - On-going
  - Leys Park Road Car Park:-** Cllr Campbell, nothing as of yet. - On-going
  - New Row Parking:-:-** On-Going
  - Trees on Alderston Drive & Hill of St Margaret's, Hedge & Trees:-** Colliston Rd residents Liz and Brian Main are worried about the situation, Factoring not in place and shrubbery overgrown, a discussion took place on the current situation and was notified that all was being looked into by the Council: - On-going
  - Parking at Nursing Home & Balfour Court: - :-** On-going.
  - Bellyeoman Rd: -** Ian Jones, missing Speed signs. :- On-Going.
  - Lampposts:-** Ian Jones to investigate missing bus stop sign on Alderston Drive.: - On-Going
  - Community Councils Meeting:-** Cllr. Campbell, Area committee Planners are Highlighting the need for a Northern Link Road:- On-Going
  - Coop Roads:-** The entrance roads is to be repaired:- On-Going.
  - Leys Park Road Flats, Tidy up Site:-** This is to be to chased this up:- On-Going.
  - Alderston Court Damaged Verges:-** Cllrs to look at this as well as lowered kerb areas, also Parking issues on Craigston Park pavements and a Robertson Road Bus stop, Police involved:- On-Going.
  - Parking at Queen Margaret Station and approaches. :-** Problems with parking on approach road at times, also kerbed areas in car park not available, can the paved areas be restored as spaces.
  - Royal Mail Vans:** TRO in place under discussion. Cllr Campbell will look into these matters.
  - Furniture in garden Robertson Rd:-** Either 47-49 Furniture removed but more dumped to be investigated:- On-Going
  - Post Box Robertson Rd Verge Damage. :-** The verge is in a bad condition, could the Box be re-sited? Could concrex be installed? All points under discussion.
