Golden Jubilee Presentation to Primary School Children

Immediate Past-Chairman, Arthur Ashton, came up with the idea to raise monies to buy a Golden Jubilee Memorial Medal for every pupil in Bellyeoman Primary.

Community Councillor Graeme Whyte handed out the medals to the a.m. nursery children and Margaret Dean, the Lord-Lieutenant of Fife gave medals to the Primary children at an Assembly later in the morning.

New Roundabout for Whitefield Road



Fife Council are to provide a new roundabout following a successful campaign started by Local Community Councillor, Graeme Whyte together with members of the Community Council. He launched a campaign to improve the safety of the junction of Whitefield Road and Robertson Road by asking for a simple painted roundabout at the junction to aid traffic flow and slow traffic heading down past the hospital.

Following a site visit made in February, Fife Council have written to Graeme confirming that the roundabout has been put in the Transportation Programme for the year 2003/2004. In addition to the roundabout, the housing developers (Queen Margaret Fauld area) are to install central islands on Whitefield Road near the Hospital and improve the pavements under the railway bridge. Speaking recently, Graeme said "I am very pleased that the suggestion for improved Road Safety has been taken up by Fife Council and thank them for their help in moving this project towards reality."

Whitefield Road Parking, A Fiasco?

The Police are now being asked to enforce parking restrictions in Whitefield Road following the opening of the new car park at Queen Margaret Hospital. A Community Councillor recently made the following observations:

18	cars parked in Whitefield Road including the grass verges
3	cars parked in Robertson Road
48	free parking spaces in the new car park and
12	free parking spaces in the existing main car Park

The Community Council want everyone to use the hard fought for FREE car parks provided and make the hospital and Whitefield Road a safer place for EVERYONE.
